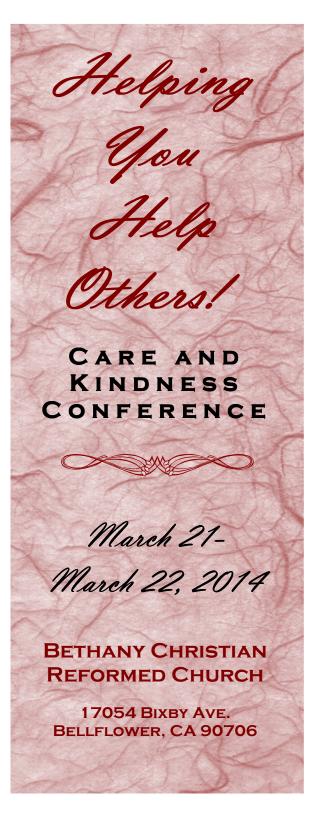

Her many careers include being a teacher, speech pathologist, psychotherapist, speaker/trainer and minister. Sandra teaches faith and she practices that faith as she flies around the country with her husband, Jim, in an airplane that he built out of spare parts! Life is a series of victories and struggles, but Sandra has emerged victorious, joyfully answering her calling to serve Jesus Christ.

Coping With Loss Rev. Jeff Funk

The death of a loved one changes our lives forever. And the movement from the "before" to the "after" is almost always a long and painful journey. From my own experiences with loss, as well as those of the many grieving people I have worked with over the years, I have learned that if we are to heal we can't go round the outside edges of our grief. Instead, we must journey through all of it, even the dark valley. There are six steps we need to take on the road to healing the hurt of our loss. This workshop will help you walk through each of those steps.

After attending this workshop, participants will: (1) understand the difference between grieving and mourning, (2) be able to describe the cycles and waves of grief, and (3) be aware of the six steps on the journey of grief and gain hope for healing.

Rev. Jeffrey Funk has served as a hospital chaplain for over 20 years where he has been confronted with morbidity and mortality on a regular basis. Prior to that, he spent 13 years as a grief counselor in the funeral industry. He and his wife, Kathryn had five children; only two are living on earth. His wife had two miscarriages. His first-born son suffered for 24 years with kidney disease before dying. His adopted son has serious mental illness and may never be able to function on his own in society. Jeffrey is a fellow struggler who comes alongside us as we wrestle with coping with loss.
